EXISTING ACADEMIC REGULATIONS

The performance of each student enrolled in a course will be assessed at the end of each semester. Evaluation of all P.G., M.Phil, M.Tech and Integrated PG courses is done under the Grading System. There will be 7 letter grades; A+, A, B+, B, C, D and F on a 10-point scale which carries 10,9,8,7,6,5,0 grade points respectively

The final result in each course will be determined based on continuous assessment and performance in the end semester examination which will be in the ratio of 40:60 in case of theory courses and 60:40 in laboratory courses (practical's).

Students must obtain a minimum of 40% marks (Grade 'D') in each course in order to pass in the Post-Graduate and Integrated PG courses examination provided that the student, who obtains less than 40% marks in any course taken by him/her, may be permitted to take the supplementary examination in the course/s concerned within four weeks after the commencement of the next semester. Appearance at such examinations shall be allowed only once. Those students who get less than 40% in the supplementary examination shall have to repeat the course concerned or take an equivalent available course with the approval of Head of the Department/Centre and the Dean of the School concerned.

In the case of M.Phil. and M. Tech. courses, a student must obtain a minimum of 50% marks in each course in order to pass in that course provided that the student who obtains less than 50% marks in any course taken by him/her, may be permitted to take a supplementary examination in the course/s concerned within four weeks after the commencement of the next semester. Appearance at such examinations shall be allowed only once. Those students who secure less than 50% in the supplementary examination shall have to repeat that course or taken an equivalent available course with the approval of the Head of the Department/Centre and the Dean of the School concerned.

Every student will be eligible for writing the end-semester examinations subject to fulfilling the attendance requirement of 75% of the classes held in all courses (Core, Elective, Foundation, etc.) and participate, to the satisfaction of the School/Department/Centre, in seminars, sessional and practical's as may be prescribed and mandatory.

REVISED ACADEMIC REGULATIONS FOR THE CURRENT SEMESTER
(JANUARY-JUNE 2020)

For outgoing students (Final Semester):

1. The final result in each course shall be determined based on continuous assessment and performance in the previous semester's examination, which shall be in the ratio of 50:50 in case of theory courses.
2. There shall not be any end semester examination. In lieu of end semester examination, 50 marks shall be computed based on the past performance in the program (CGPA) till previous semester.
3. For the practical/laboratory courses, the final marks shall be determined based on continuous assessment of the laboratory records and will be scaled to 100 marks. There shall not be any exams for the practical/laboratory courses.

4. In case a student has not written/appeared for any continuous assessment before the lockdown, or an online assessment during the lockdown period, then he/she has to appear for one after their return to the university.
5. The continuous assessment is divided into two parts of 25 marks each. The best of the continuous assessment(s) shall be considered for the first 25 marks after scaling it. For the remaining 25 marks, it shall be maximum of the performance of the student in the continuous assessment (scaled to 25 marks) and 75% of 25 (i.e.18.75) marks.
6. The overall marks obtained in continuous assessment and CGPA of past performance as explained above shall be added to arrive at an equivalent grade for each subject.
7. In case a student is not satisfied with the grade, he/she can appear for the special examination, on reopening as per the date decided by the Academic unit (as per the revised Academic Calendar). There shall be no further supplementary or improvement examination for the outgoing students.
8. In case of dissertations/project reports, the student shall be assessed based on dissertation/report submitted. Internal committee(s) of the School shall assess the dissertation/project and award the marks/grades.
9. Mandatory 75% attendance requirement is waived-off, as a very special case, considering the present situation for the current semester.

Important Note: In case of out-going students, being satisfied with the grades announced, he/she can apply for an e-pass through e-Governance portal.

In case of out-going students, not being satisfied with the grades announced, he/she can apply for an e-pass through e-Governance portal based on their date of arrival to the campus with a clear plan to appear for the special exam.

For ongoing students (Intermediate semester):

1. The final result in each course shall be determined based on continuous assessment and performance in the end semester examination (as per the schedule mentioned in the Academic Calendar), which shall be in the ratio of 50:50 in case of theory courses.
2. For the practical/laboratory courses, the final marks shall be determined based on continuous assessment of the laboratory records and will be scaled to 100 marks. There shall not be any end semester exams for the practical/laboratory courses.
3. In case a student has not written/appeared for any continuous assessment before the lockdown, or an online assessment during the lockdown period, then he/she has to appear for one after their return to the university.
4. The continuous assessment is divided into two parts of 25 marks each. The best of the continuous assessment shall be considered for the first 25 marks after scaling it. For the remaining 25 marks, it shall be maximum of the performance of the student in the continuous assessment (scaled to 25 marks) and 75% of 25 (i.e. 18.75) marks.
5. All students must appear for the end semester examination and weightage shall be 50 marks. Those who fail/absent or want to improve in a course can appear for supplementary/improvement examinations within two weeks after the commencement of the next semester.

6. In case of project reports, the student shall be assessed based on project report submitted. Internal committee(s) of the School shall assess the project and award the marks/grades.
7. Mandatory 75% attendance requirement is waived-off, as a very special case, considering the present situation for the current semester.
