**Subject: Revised Academic Regulations for Jan- June-2021**

## **EXISTING ACADEMIC REGULATIONS**

The performance of each student enrolled in a course will be assessed at the end of each semester. Evaluation of all P.G., M.Phil, M.Tech and Integrated PG courses is done under the Grading System. There will be 7 letter grades; A+, A, B+, B, C, D and F on a 10-point scale which carries 10,9,8,7,6,5,0 grade points respectively

The final result in each course will be determined based on continuous assessment and performance in the end semester examination which will be in the ratio of 40:60 in case of theory courses and 60:40 in laboratory courses (practicals).

Students must obtain a minimum of 40% marks (Grade 'D') in each course in order to pass in the Post-Graduate and Integrated PG courses examination provided that the student, who obtains less than 40% marks in any course taken by him/her, may be permitted to take the supplementary examination in the course/s concerned within four weeks after the commencement of the next semester. Appearance at such examinations shall be allowed only once. Those students who get less than 40% in the supplementary examination shall have to repeat the course concerned or take an equivalent available course with the approval of Head of the Department/Centre and the Dean of the School concerned.

In the case of M.Phil. and M. Tech. courses, a student must obtain a minimum of 50% marks in each course in order to pass in that course provided that the student who obtains less than 50% marks in any course taken by him/her, may be permitted to take a supplementary examination in the course/s concerned within four weeks after the commencement of the next semester. Appearance at such examinations shall be allowed only once. Those students who secure less than 50% in the supplementary examination shall have to repeat that course or taken an equivalent available course with the approval of the Head of the Department/Centre and the Dean of the School concerned.

**REVISED ACADEMIC REGULATIONS FOR THE CURRENT SEMESTER (JANUARY-JUNE 2021), Based on UGC- Guidelines on Examinations and Academic Calendar in view of the Covid-19 Pandemic- July-21, dated 16-7-2021**

**For Outgoing / Terminal / Final Semester students):**

1. All outgoing students must register for the end semester exams to be held in July 2021 and download their Hall Tickets from e-governance portal before appearing for the exams.
2. The attendance requirement of 75% stands waived for this semester as a special case in view of the lockdown due to Pandemic.
3. The final result in each course shall be determined based on continuous assessment and performance in the end semester exams to be held in July 2021 which shall be in the ratio of 50:50 in case of theory courses. Appearing in the end semester exam is mandatory.
4. For the practical/laboratory courses, the final marks shall be determined based on continuous assessment of the laboratory records and will be scaled to 100 marks. There shall not be any exams for the practical/laboratory courses.
5. In case of dissertations/project reports, the student shall be assessed based on dissertation/report submitted. Internal committee(s) of the Academic units shall assess the dissertation/project and award the marks/grades for the PG courses. For M.Tech. Project reports, it shall be evaluated by the external Examiners.
6. The outgoing students having backlogs of previous semesters including foundation courses if any, and doing a recourse in this semester will have to appear for the exams to be eligible for the degree.
7. The Academic units have been authorised to conduct the end semester exams in online/offline/blended mode as mentioned in UGC letter dated 16-7-2021.
8. The timings may be decided by the faculty in consultation with the students to avoid any clash of exams etc.
9. The supplementary/special supplementary improvement exams will be conducted in August, 21 as already notified.
10. The ongoing students of Integrated M.Sc./M.A. Social Sciences, M.A. Humanities, and M. Optom who wish or intend to exit have to inform the Director, CIS and the Dean/Head of the School and write the exams. These results will be retained by the Academic Units and whenever the students apply for exit will be sent to the CE's office along with the marks of the exam. The Director, CIS, shall inform the concerned Academic units about such students within 2 days who must appear for end semester exams.


**For Ongoing / Intermediate semester students:**

1. The final result in each course shall be determined based on continuous assessment and performance till previous semester (minimum CGPA 5.00) which shall be in the ratio of 50:50 in case of theory courses.
2. There shall not be any end semester examination. In lieu of end semester examination, 50 marks shall be computed based on the past performance in the program (CGPA) till previous semester
3. For the practical/laboratory courses, the final marks shall be determined based on continuous assessment of the laboratory records and will be scaled to 100 marks. There shall not be any exams for the practical/laboratory courses.
4. The overall marks obtained in continuous assessment and CGPA of past performance as explained above shall be added to arrive at an equivalent grade for each subject in this semester.
5. In case a student is not satisfied with the grade, he/she can appear for the special examination, on reopening of the University. There shall be no further supplementary or improvement examination for the on-going students in this semester. The special exam will be conducted for 50 marks in lieu of end semester exams and not for continuous assessment if the student makes a request through proper channel.

6. In case of dissertations and project reports (of PG students only), the student shall be assessed based on dissertation/report submitted. Internal committee (s) of the Academic units shall assess the dissertation/project and award the marks/grades.
7. The attendance requirement of 75% stands waived for this semester as a special case in view of the lockdown due to Pandemic.
8. For the **course work of M.Phil. and Ph.D.** during this semester, the result in each course shall be determined based on the continuous assessment for 50 marks and end semester exam for 50 marks.

**NOTE:**

1. All Academic Units to check the mapping of courses in e-governance for the Jan-June 2021, semester for the ongoing and outgoing students.
2. All faculty member are requested to enter marks of continuous assessment for all students out of 50 marks latest by 31.07.2021. Remaining calculation shall be automatically done in e-governance portal for ongoing students. For outgoing students, the faculty shall enter marks out of 50 for the end semester exams conducted latest by 31.07.2021
3. The Deans and Heads are requested to ensure floating of the courses for next semester (July-Dec 21) semester latest by 02-08-2021 to enable semester registration for the students from 02.08.2021 to 16.08.2021
